Topic outline

The United Nations adopted the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in September 2015. The scientific community recognises both a need and a responsibility to make a solid contribution to achieve the '2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development'. As the global umbrella of more than 140 national science organisations, many of which are science academies, the International Science Council (ISC) identified the 2030 Agenda as a focus of its activities during the next years. In parallel to contributing to and supporting the work of the ISC at global level, most ISC national member organisations in Europe also belong to regional academy networks, whose science for policy work can be seen as contribution to the achievement of the SDGs. Finally, a number of academies are also engaged in 2030 Agenda activities at national level. Concentrating on the situation in Europe, this meeting will consider their SDG work in each of the three arenas, i.e. national, regional and global, from the perspective of science that provides input and of the policy-making sector as the receiver. Based on these examples, the meeting will reflect on how these three arenas connect.
